



Targeted Call for Research into Dementia in Indigenous Australians

for funding commencing in 2018

NHMRC opened a Targeted Call for Research (TCR) into Dementia in Indigenous Australians on 19 April 2017 which closed on 31 May 2017.

The aim of implementing this call is to provide funding for culturally appropriate research that specifically addresses dementia in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians and the impact on their families and carers.

Applications received during the call were peer reviewed by an expert panel of researchers. Following peer review, five applications were funded by NHMRC. Details of these awarded grants are provided below.
